December 6th - Chocolate Day for Dutch Children

Amongst many others, Saint Nicholas is the patron saint of sailors, merchants, children and pawnbrokers. His reputation evolved among the pious, as was common for early Christian saints and his legendary habit of secret gift giving gave rise to the folklore of Santa Claus (Saint Nick) through the Dutch Sinterklaas.

In Northern Europe, especially the Netherlands and Germany, children will often receive a small gift, usually chocolate on this day as a present prior to Christmas.

This perhaps arose because on the 6th December every sailor or ex sailor (which would be most of the population) would attend a church celebration and on their way home, would attend a fair and buy a gift for their family. The custom survives as children will leave an empty shoe in the foyer in anticipation of a present from Saint Nicholas.

When the Dutch first colonised New Amsterdam (now New York) the tradition of Sinterklaas morphed into Santa Claus.

Out of interest it is quite possible that Saint Nicholas attended the council of Nicaea and was an opponent of Arius and in one legend he slapped him across the face much to the anger of the Emperor!
